The provision of rural water supply consists of geohydrologically surveying viable sites, drilling of a borehole and casing it with PVC 113 mm pipes, constructing an apron and drainage, installing an Afridev handpump with all its downhole components and finally conducting training of a Water Committee on all aspects of Community Based Management of their new water supply.

Guarantees
